



2018 Set Aside Clinics

August—November

If you have an Arizona conviction on your criminal record, you may qualify to set aside your conviction and restore your civil rights.

If your Arizona criminal conviction is causing you problems such as accessing jobs and housing you might consider applying to set aside the judgment. Come to a free clinic to learn if you might benefit from a set aside. You do not need to pre-qualify in order to attend a clinic; all are welcome.

You must be eligible for Community Legal Services to obtain legal assistance or direct representation from an advocate. Eligibility is determined in part by income level and type of judgment.
